Middle 50% SAT score of 1200-1340; middle 50% ACT composite score of 25 to 30; average unweighted high school GPA of 3.64. SAT and ACT scores are optional.

STUDENT ACTIVITIES

Over 100 student clubs from academic to special interest to club sports. Other ways to get involved: student government, Campus Program Board, Pilots After Dark, our student-run online news source, yearbook, and radio station.

STUDY ABROAD

Semester program locations include Austria, Australia, France, England, Ireland, Spain, and Italy (UP financial aid applies). Locations vary for summer programs and short-term, faculty-led programs and may include Ecuador, Malawi, Japan, and the Dominican Republic.

SCHOLARSHIPS & FINANCIAL AID

For 2023-24, the average amount of aid awarded to full-time, first-year students from all sources was \$44,075, excluding loans.

TUITION, HOUSING & MEALS

For the 2024-25 academic year, tuition is \$56,800, average on-campus housing is \$11,610, and food (meal plan 2) is \$5,650.

Most merit scholarships range from \$24,000-\$30,000 annually and are renewable. Stackable scholarships are also available for first-gen, out-of-state, engineering, music and theater, ROTC, and students attending Catholic high schools.
