# **Campus Ministry**

• In collaboration with our Residence Life, Campus Ministry sent almost 200 students on retreat at the end of September. Students from all nine active residence halls enjoyed weekends at Camp Howard, where they were able to grow closer in community, share in recreational activities, and dive deeper into faith and spirituality.

- In collaboration with the <u>Latinx Student Union</u>, Campus Ministry celebrated the beginning of the month of November and the Día de los Muertos with our traditional ofrenda, an altar of remembrance for family and friends who have died. Campus Ministry has also collected names of deceased loved ones and placed them in a basket before the main altar in the Chapel of Christ the Teacher, where they will be prayed for throughout November.

## Moreau Center for Service and Justice (MCSJ)

- On September 4th, <u>Clare Kennedy</u> (Program Manager for Community Partnerships) and <u>Claire Moore</u> (Student Employment) hosted the first Student Employment and Service Fair. This collaborative event brought together many of our <u>Community Service Work Study</u> nonprofit partners (to name a few: Portland Tennis & Education, St. Johns Swapnplay, Do Good Multnomah, Catholic Charities of Oregon), on-campus employers, and campus resources to connect directly with students. There were 30 different groups in attendance who were able to speak with 350 students who came seeking resources, services, and employment opportunities. This event strengthened relationships with local nonprofit partners and supported students in finding unique employment and volunteer opportunities that serve the Portland community.
- During fall break, 8 students and 2 staff members participated in the <u>Social Justice Immersion</u> traveling to the Yakima Valley in Washington. The group stayed on a farm and community center on the Yakama Reservation, engaging with over ten local organizations and cultural centers. Group visited Heritage University, toured JustLiving Farms, volunteered with Nuestra Casa to support ESL classes for farmworkers, and learned about the Ttáwaxt Birth Justice Center's work on maternal health disparities among Native women. This experience deepened their

understanding of social justice issues and allowed for deep reflection and bonding.





• MCSJ rebuilt UP's connection with <u>L'Arche Portland</u>, a community of adults with and without intellectual disabilities who share life together intentionally. UP students attended varied events on and off campus such as: a Garden Work Party, a Halloween Party, and a Benefit Celebration (in partnership with University Events). Student volunteers connected with community members and supported at this benefit event, raising \$60,000 for the L'Arche Portland community - building a kinder, more human world through mutual relationships and creating a sense of belonging.

# **Student Activities**

- ASUP Executive Board and Senate gathered on September 21st for a successful retreat.

# **Health and Counseling Center (HCC)**

- In partnership with the School of Nursing and Health Innovations (SONHI), HCC hosted clinic days specifically to support UP nursing students in completing their requirements for clinical rotations. This was the first time offering these collaborative clinics and the response was excellent!
- The counseling team has adopted a new model of care allowing for easier access to same day appointments and increased availability to meet student needs. Most students seeking a counseling appointment are offered appointments same day or next day.
- HCC hosted their first Doctorate of Nursing Practice student for clinical rotations this fall. HCC medical staff are thrilled to support SONHI and contribute to training the next generation of nurse practitioners.
- Over 300 flu and COVID vaccines were administered to students, faculty, and staff this fall through HCC hosted vaccine clinics.
- Students continue to have expanded access to mental health services through the HCC partnership with <a href="MetterMynd">BetterMynd</a>. BetterMynd appointments are available over telehealth on weekends and evenings, providing flexible options to students with busy schedules.

# **Student Wellness Center (SWC)**

- SWC started the academic year strong by offering new students and their families an opportunity to have fun with, and learn from, campus student support providers at our Fall Wellness Fair (photo below, at left).
- SWC provided <u>Green Dot</u> Bystander Intervention trainings for student leaders in Residence Life, Anchor Leaders, and Learning Assistants. Over the course of August through October, they exceeded the number of students who received the full Bystander training compared to the entire last academic year. They have also been piloting healthy relationships programming in collaboration with <u>Colin Stewart</u>, Athletics, and the Center for Gender and Sexuality.





• There is a new <u>StockUP</u> food pantry for our students, which opened in September and is hosted twice weekly for open hours as well as access by appointment. SWC initiated food and hygiene drives in October and will continue to do so as we head into the holiday season. <u>StockUP FAQs</u> >
