

# What happens if I report an incident to the University?



## Report made

Harassment, misconduct, or violence is reported to a university employee, or directly to Title IX.



## Report sent to Title IX Coordinator

Disclosures made to non-confidential UP employees must be shared with the Title IX Coordinator (*see reverse for a list of confidential resources*).



## Meeting to discuss options and resources

Student is invited to meet with Title IX Coordinator to learn about resources, support, and resolution options



## Student chooses how to proceed\*

Student may choose to receive support services, and/or may choose to file a formal complaint.



## File complaint, if student chooses\*

### Informal resolution -

For less serious conduct, this may involve support and accommodations for the reporting party, and/or action by the responding party.

### Formal resolution -

For more serious conduct, this involves an investigation and the student conduct process.

## \*A formal complaint is required in some situations

While the student's wishes will be taken into account as much as possible, the Title IX Coordinator may sign a formal complaint for allegations of violence, threats, use of weapons, and serial predation, or similar factors.

## Supportive measures that are available:

- Housing accommodations
- Academic accommodations
- Referrals to counseling and/or medical services
- No contact orders
